

What's Happening

Healthy Lunchbox Idea

Feelgood flapjacks

Ingredients

50g butter, plus extra for greasing

2 tbsp. smooth peanut butter

3 tbsp. honey or maple syrup

2 ripe bananas, mashed

1 apple, peeled & grated

250g rolled oats

85g dried apricots, chopped

100g raisins

85g mixed seed (e.g. pumpkin, sunflower)

Step 1

Heat oven to $160^{\circ}/140^{\circ}$ (fan).

Grease & line a 20cm square tin with baking parchment. Heat the butter, peanut butter and honey or maple syrup in a small pan until melted. Add the mashed banana, apple and 100ml hot water, mix to combine.

Step 2

Tip the oats, the dried fruit and the seeds into a large bowl. Pour the combined banana & apple & stir until everything is coated by the wet mixture. Tip into the cake tin & level the surface. Bake for 55 mins, until golden. Leave to cool in the tin. Cut into 12 pieces to serve or store in an airtight container in the fridge. They will keep for up to 3 days.

The Marist Brothers responded to a request from the Catholic community of Waikato, and established a Marist School for boys in the old St Mary's Parish Hall in 1922. By the mid 1950's the burgeoning roll meant a larger College was needed, and the Waikato Catholic community generously supported a massive fundraising drive to make that happen.

In preparation for the move, the name St John's College was chosen and this was adopted in 1961, while our pupils were still in Hamilton East. In February 1962, St John's College opened on our Hillcrest 'hilltop' campus.
